

- **The government has announced a pause on Local Government Reorganisation** for 14 areas across the country including Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent. Local elections for district councils will now be held in May 2027, alongside the already planned parish council elections, but the proposed elections to unitary authorities (North and South Staffordshire) will not take place while the review is underway. The change of plans follows legal advice received by the Secretary of State
- I was delighted to attend the **15th anniversary celebrations for Brown Edge Lunch Club**, which was started by former Councillor Margaret Boon to help people in the village who had become isolated or were feeling lonely. In true Margaret style, she found enthusiastic volunteers, a venue, club members, involved her family and friends and everything was organised very quickly. - **Sandy Lane Centre** has been notified that the parish council has nominated us to be added to SMDC's list of **Community Assets** and we've been asked to respond by 17th September if we have any comments. **The Brew Club** continues to meet on a Tuesday morning and the **Christian Fellowship** meets on alternate Sunday mornings. Next meeting is on Sunday 20th September at 11am. All are welcome
- As an Alderman of Staffordshire, I was invited by SMDC to attend **the raising of the Red Ensign on Merchant Navy Day**, to pay tribute to our merchant seafarers, both past and present. They bravely ensured that Britain continued to have food and supplies during the wars in very dangerous conditions and today they continue to serve us. This was very well attended by the Royal British Legion, Deputy Lieutenant Simon Davies, Reverend Arthur Hack, councillors and citizens

- **As part of World Alzheimer's month**, Staffordshire Police are urging families of people with dementia to sign up for a scheme that provides police with key information about them if they go missing. The Herbert Protocol is a quick and simple way of having useful details at the ready if a particularly vulnerable person, such as someone living with dementia, goes missing. When you create an account with the new provider **Safe and Found Online**, you will be asked to fill out a form that includes a loved one's details, such as required medication, mobile numbers, places previously located and an up to date photograph
- On Saturday 26th September at 9.30am in the Churnet Room, SMDC will be hosting **'Moorlands Water Day'** in collaboration with the Dove Catchment Partnership and the Environment Agency. This will enable people to learn from each other's experiences and
